
DEAR CHILD:

Waiting Child Spotlight

A smart, inquisitive child, Austin likes to ask questions. He is a little shy, but can be outgoing in a structured setting. Austin enjoys reading, soccer, hockey, being outdoors, school, and movies. He is an intelligent guy and excels at academics. Adults in his life describe Austin as "creative with a positive disposition."



A potential adoptive family should be able to model and enforce

appropriate boundaries and interactions with adults and other children in a structured setting. A family that can provide a high level of supervision would be best for this sibling group. Austin would love to play sports, watch movies, and have fun in a family with a mom and dad, and a dog.

Alicia is Austin's little sister, and like her brother, can be quite shy around unfamiliar people. However, once you get to know her, Alicia is a fun, interesting child to be around. She is fascinated with the world around her and is always ready for a new activity. She enjoys cheerleading, animals, bowling, reading, school, and playing with friends.

Alicia sometimes struggles with one-on-one interactions, but is currently improving due to counseling. She enjoys receiving attention and benefits from positive reinforcement.

Alicia would benefit from a loving family who can provide a structured environment, academic assistance, and attention. Since she is so active and curious, a young couple might be best for Alicia. She would like a family that is "smart and caring" and that celebrates holidays together. Alicia wants people to know that she is "happy and a good friend."

It would be best if a future family for these siblings had no other children close in age or younger. Dangerous Playgrounds: Drug Awareness & Trends

Do you know the meaning of terms like Spice, Budda, Robo-Trippin', Trail Mixing and Space Monkey? Would you be able to tell if someone is drunk or high, or experimenting with drugs? If you answered "no" to these questions, then this class is a must for you! Participants will leave this training with a working knowledge of the most common substances of abuse including terminology, visual identity, how they are used, how they are made, and the effects of substances on the community. This class is recommended for foster/adoptive parents, social workers and caregivers of children that are pre-teen through young adult age, as well as anyone working with birth families that have substance related issues.

Mental Health First Aid

MHFA helps the public identify, understand, and respond to signs of mental illnesses and substance use disorders. This course introduces participants to risk factors and warning signs of mental health problems, builds understanding of their impact, reduces the stigma attached to mental health diagnoses and overviews common treatments. Participants will learn a 5-step action plan encompassing the skills, resources and knowledge to help an individual in crisis connect with appropriate professional care. Part I and Part 2 will be offered at different times throughout the fall. You will receive credit separately for each of these two courses and if you choose to complete all 12 hours, you will receive a mental health certification. Part I highlights Depression, Bi-polar Disorder, Suicidal and Non-suicidal Selfinjuries, Anxiety Disorders, Panic Attacks, Post-Traumatic Stress **Disorder and Obsessive Compulsive Disorders.**

Dare to Care About Skin & Hair

Individuals who are parenting a child or are considering parenting a child of an ethnicity different from their own find there are all types of challenges from finding ways to respect culture and heritage as well as navigating the world of skin and hair care. Newly updated, this course will walk you through the process of caring for the skin and hair of children of color, as well as provide discussion of cultural practices that can better arm you as a parent in celebrating all the children in your home.
